



Americans eat a lot of meat. In fact, the U.S. government reports that the average American eats over 220 pounds* of meat a year. According to some researchers, most of that comes in the form* of burgers. You may feel a little strange about this, but when you see many burger shops in the U.S., you can understand it

So can you guess why burger shops are very popular among Americans? To find the reason, you should learn about the origin of the burger. There are a lot of interesting stories [**** 5**] it. Most Americans say that burgers were first served in the U.S. However, you might be surprised to hear that the first art of the burger goes back to ancient Rome. In a Roman cookbook in the fifth century, a recipe shows how to make something like a meat patty*. In 1762, then, the famous Earl of Sandwich* decided to take his meat and put it between two slices of bread. This is the beginning of a simple burger. Soon after that, many people also began to make and eat it.

By the 20th century, many types of burgers were born; cheeseburger, bacon and egg burger, fish burger, and so on. And, not only in the U.S. but also [to] the world, fast food restaurants have grown so large that they have become chains of restaurants with sales of billions of dollars. The most famous ones, McDonald's and Burger King, are open across the U.S. These restaurants serve burgers quickly, and they have become a symbol of American culture since the 1970s. They have achieved* this, because burgers are easy to get, carry out, and eat. As a result, you can casually enjoy them anywhere. This is the reason there are many burger shops in America.

It is said, however, that these foods are harmful to health, and the environment. Eating them very often will surely make you fat. ① Producing a lot of beef makes the environment worse. So, American scientists have given an interesting solution to the problems about eating burgers. It's the veggie burger, made without meat, [5] pressing together small pieces of vegetables. It can be low in calories*, cooked easily at home, and of course, very popular among Americans. Some people are afraid that it's not tasty, or they might pay a higher price for it. Never! Just try it, and you'll find ② . You also get it at a reasonable* price, and best of all, it's truly healthy.

次の英文は、結衣(Yui)とアメリカからの留学生のエマ(Emma)との対話である。この対話を読んで、後の各間に答えよ。

Yui : Hi, Emma. How are you doing?

Emma : I'm doing well, thanks. How about you?

Yui : Yeah, I'm good, thank you. So, how's your life in Japan?

Emma : I had some problems. Can you give me some advice?

Yui : A

Emma: Thank you. Can you tell me how to use the word, *kawaii*? I know it means cute or pretty in English but Japanese people use it in other situations.

Yui : B You can use the word in a variety of situations. For example, you can say the word for not only babies and children, but also for people of all ages.

Emma : I know. The other day, I went to a convenience store near my house and met Nana, one of my classmates. She was with her grandmother. So, I said to her grandmother, "*Totemo kawaii desune*." Then, both of them looked a little surprised. I had a strange feeling but I didn't know why.

Yui : Hmm, I don't use *kawaii* in that situation. You can always use the word for babies and children, but you shouldn't use it for adults who you meet for the first time.

Emma : Oh, I see. It sounds like using it may be difficult for me.

Yui : Don't worry. If you keep on using it, you'll be able to use it well someday.

Emma: Yeah, I hope so. I also don't know how to use *yabai* or *sumimasen*. These words have too many meanings, so they're really hard to understand. I have another story that I want to tell you.

Yui : OK.

Emma : When I went to school by bus, an old lady got on the bus. I thought of giving up my seat to her. So, I stood up and told her to sit down on the seat. She looked a little troubled but suddenly laughed and sat on the seat. Why did she laugh?

Yui : Hmm, can you say that again? How did you say to her?

Emma : OK. I said, "Douzo sawatte kudasai."

Yui : Oh, I see. I think she heard that you were asking her to touch you. The sounds of those two Japanese words are very similar. That's why. Do you have anything else?

Emma : Yes. Last week, I had a slight headache, so I went to a drugstore.

Because I had no idea what to buy, I asked a store clerk. She kindly helped me choose the right medicine.

Yui : That's nice. What was the problem with that?

Emma : When she explained about the medicine, she said *fukuyou*. But I didn't know the meaning.

Yui : Did you ask her the meaning?

Emma: C She looked so busy then. Like this, compound words* are one of the most difficult things for me in my life in Japan. I can see the meaning of easy ones, but sometimes Japanese people use difficult ones by using two kanji characters. I usually think about the meaning of each one of the kanji characters to understand the meaning of the compound words, but I can never understand the meaning.

Yui : Yes, some of them are too difficult. Sometimes, even Japanese people don't know their meanings. We should use easy Japanese especially for people from overseas without using difficult compound words.
